
TRACT DISTRIBUTION IN FRANKFURT

Another of our ministries at Frankfurt was the distribution of German language Gospel tracts. On Sundays, after we had all been to church services, various members of Youth For Christ would meet at a location such as Hauptbahnhof, or the Frankfurt Zoo, or a bridge crossing the Main River, and greet German civilians with "Etwas zu lesen," Several bridges on the Main were temporarily renamed by the US military for easy identification. Most had been badly damaged by the bombing of Frankfurt. One, "The Brooklyn Bridge," remained open only to foot traffic into the center of the city. Another was "the Golden Gate Bridge" As we distributed the tracts and tried to speak German, we hoped that the people would understand that we were asking if they would like something to read. They politely took the tracts and we optimistically believed that many would become Christians or become encouraged in the faith. I am sure however, that many were simply curious about the American soldiers. Personally, I had written to several Christian publishers in the United States requesting tracts, and they sent us many. In fact, our YFC newsletter in September reported that we were distributing over 50,000 tracts a month. Almost 30 different tract organizations sent them.

FRANKFURT, GERMANY: "Last Sunday afternoon we distributed 10,000 tracts. Our committee is growing in spirit and membership. Therefore we will have need of an increased quantity of tracts, especially of German text. Enclosed is a love offering of ten dollars. We pray you will accept this in the Name of Christ Jesus. We will be sending more from time to time." (This is from the Youth for Christ in Frankfurt, a group that doesn't just meet and sing songs and listen to a speaker, but a group that goes out into the highway and byway with the Gospel.)





Though our regular meetings were held at Roundup Chapel within the fenced military compound, we were allowed to "sign-in" German guests. As such we met some very fine Christians who expressed gratefulness for the liberation that the Americans and the Allied forces had brought them even though their loss was so great. Many had seen their homes destroyed, their city ruined and loved ones disappear in a variety of ways. One of those individuals was Guenther Vahlberg of the nearby town of Hochst. I first met him when I became Chaplain's Assistant at McNair Barracks in Hochst in October 1946. He was fifteen years old and was helping Chaplain John B. Youngs as an interpreter. The Chaplain not only conducted service in the small chapel on the compound, but led English speaking worship services at the Lutheran church. At that time after the war,, many wives joined their husbands in the military and gathered together on Sundays for worship. This was the church that Gunther and his mother attended, and we found them to be very fine Christians. I tell more about Gunther and his mother in my life's "Chrono."

A FOLLOW-UP STORY OF "ROUNDUP CHAPEL"

In November 1990, my wife Isabel, and our daughter Barbara visited Germany on vacation. We went to Frankfurt and in addition to touring the sites that I had seen in 1946 after the bombing of 1945, we found Round-Up Chapel, as we once called it 241 Eschersheimer Strasse. It had become a Lutheran Nursery School. Though it was a Saturday and the school was closed we found a janitor who allowed us to enter. What an emotional moment to stand there forty-four years later and remember those deep spiritual experiences when I was so young joining together with others in the military in singing the praises of the Lord while so far away from home. Here I am in 1990.

It would also be of interest in knowing about other places in Germany, like Augsburg, where there were Youth For Christ meetings.

In December 1946 I was scheduled for discharge from the Army and returned to the United States in January 1947. My last days in Germany were over Christmas 1946 in the icy cold weather at Bremmerhaven on the North Sea waiting for the troop ship.

Frankfurt Youth For Christ continued. As I look back, I can say, with considerable emotion, that those days and experiences helped me, not only in the development of my walk with Christ, but they were also a foundation upon which I built a future ministry. My heart is filled with gratefulness to the Lord for those days and for the impact that so many individuals had upon my life.






The cover Picture
