- Get an Old-Fashion Turkey Dinner at Duffin's new dining room - Grand Opening on November 8, 9, and 10. - Horse Shoe Tavern, 9th and Mifflin.
- A Jack Frost Carnival and Halloween Parade was held on November 6 in Schaefferstown, sponsored by the Heidelberg Lions Club.
- President Harry S. Truman defeated New York Governor Thomas E. Dewey and was re-elected President of the United States for a second term.
- "Water is Scarce" at the City Supply Dam Number Two at Rexmont and required the tapping of water from the new High Bridge Water System.
- Thomas Deufel, "probably the oldest voter in Lebanon County", voted on his ninetieth birthday. He and his wife celebrated their sixty-fourth wedding anniversary and are living in the same house they built sixty-three years ago.
- Annville Township Commissioners voted to purchase a new uniform for policeman Herman W. Heisey, and two new tires for the police cruiser car.
- Palmyra Boro Council levied a Ten-Dollar a year tax on Juke Boxes, and stated that licenses would Not Be Given to operators of gambling devices.
- Trinity Lutheran Church and the First Evangelical Congregational Church in Lebanon were hosts for the 57th Annual Christian Endeavor Convention on November 4 and 5 with Dr. Norman W. Paulin of Philadelphia, speaker.
- "Bambi" in Technicolor was showing at the Astor Theater in Annville.

- The Very Rev. Paul. D. Weaver is the new pastor of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church in Lebanon.
