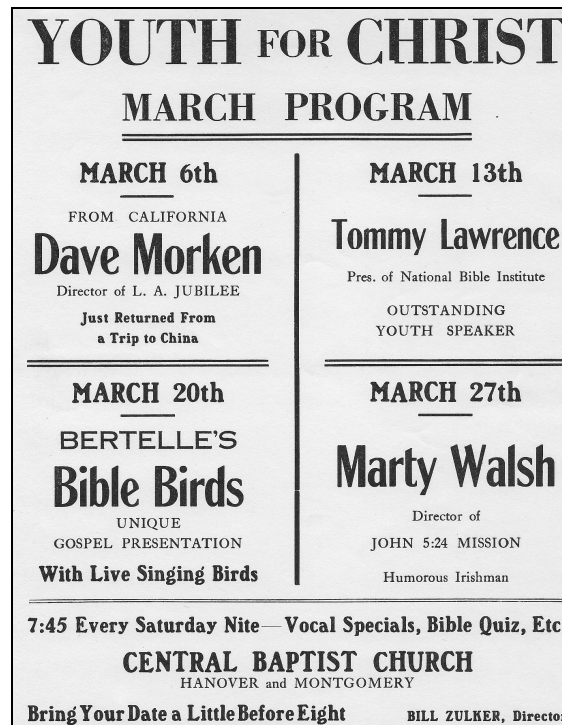
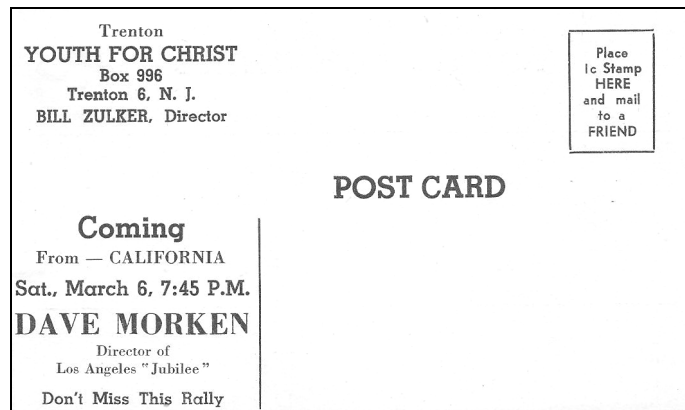

– Gospel presentation with live singing birds.

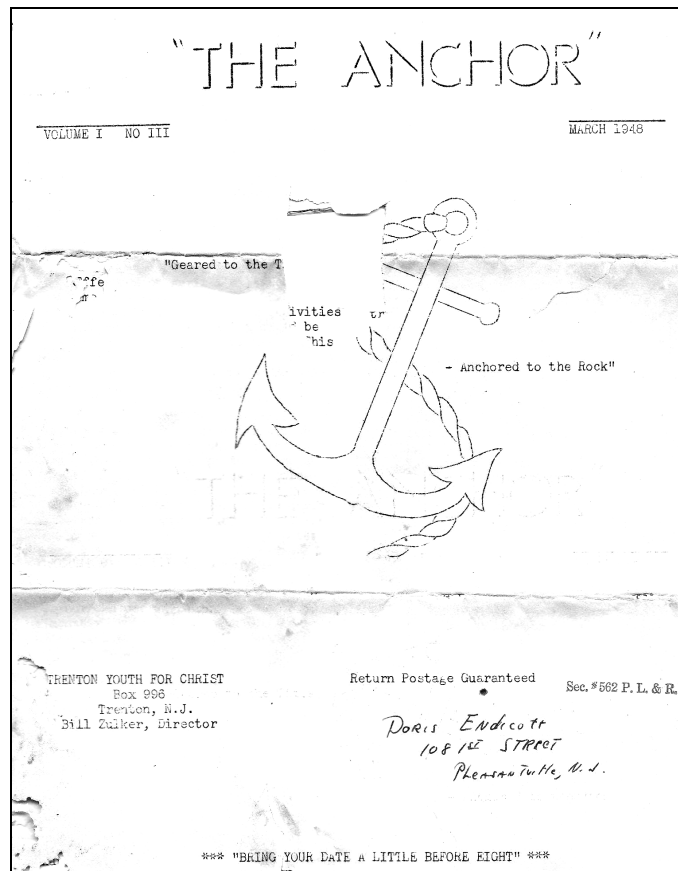

\$300 NEEDED

Even though we will be fixing it up ourselves, there will be a lot of material that will be needed. This we have estimated at the cost of at least \$300. This sounds like a lot of money but there must be enough people who are interested in seeing the young people off the streets and in a Youth Center that will be spiritually directed, to meet this need. Electric fixtures have to be installed, paper paint, boards, plaster, linoleum, and many other things will have to be bought. Listed below are some other things that will also be needed.

If you have any of these and would like to see them put to a good use, give us a call. Anything that we don't use will be sold and the money used to buy other needs.

Located only one block from the two main streets in this large city, it is our aim to maintain a place for young people to "RELAX AND ENJOY THEMSELVES". The main point is that spiritual Emphasis will be put on all activities. May God Grant that through the days to come at the Youth Center, that many may come to know Christ as Saviour and be "born again", John 3:7. You pray that God will bless us to that end and I know that He'll bless you for your part."

THE HALLELUJAH HOUR

Effective on April 1 will be new name of Trenton YOUTH FOR CHRIST. We have felt that due to other activities which we begin this month, it would be best if we had our own local name. This will be "THE HALLELUJAH HOUR". Functions of this now are the "HALLELUJAH RALLY" and the "HALLELUJAH YOUTH CENTER".

THE HALLELUJAH YOUTH CENTER is something which has just materialized today. Just this morning, the lease was signed for the renting of the third and fourth floors of 31 South Broad Street in Trenton. We Praise God for the wonderful way in which we were able to get this. Had I an opportunity to tell each one of you the way in which this materialized, I'm sure you would join me in saying "HALLELUJAH". We have taken possession of these two floors with the agreement that we fix them and put them in shape for our own use in the way we see fit, at a monthly rent of \$75, beginning on November 1, 1948. The first months rent shall be paid on June 1, 1948.

Starting Thursday of this week, we will begin cleaning up the place and getting ready for the paper hangers. Many of our young people have asked their dads to help in the things which we ourselves cannot do. If you have a free evening and can help in any way, please contact us.

We need some men that are electricians, some carpenters to repair few spots in the floor and ceiling, some that know how to throw paper on the wall and others that might be able to do a little plastering and things that are unforeseen

April 3, 1978 – Word of Life Rally with Jack Wyrzten in the Philadelphia Convention Hall. A New York excursion train chartered by Word of Life stopped for us at the Trenton Train Station en-route to Philly. The round trip fare was \$1.25 per person. We departed from Trenton at 3:00 pm and returned at 11:00 pm. Upon arrival at the 30th Street Station in Philly, the crowd walked up Market Street to 34th Street then South to the Hall – about eight blocks. We were all singing hymns along the way. Quite an experience. (no rally in Trenton this evening).

April 10, 1948 – Rev. Earl D. Opie, from California. “The Motorcyclist of Melody” with his Sermons in songs in Technicolor Slides – and, Rev. Charles Anderson, of Brookdale Baptist Church, Bloomfield, N.J. Earl was the brother of Billy Opie, the evangelist, under whose ministry I surrendered my life to Christ and felt the call to the Gospel ministry. Charles Anderson was a member of the three-clergy tour I made with Wycliffe missions to the jungles of Southern Mexico in 1958.

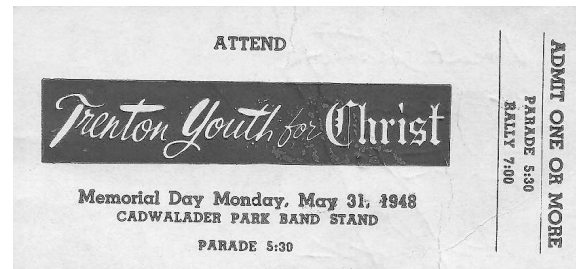


