IN APRIL 1920

- The *Lebanon Daily News* was published daily but not on Sundays. A. B. Schropp was Managing Editor, President and Treasurer.
- Lebanon had a new Theater - THE JACKSON - with a pipe organ and cushioned chairs to be installed later.
- Easter Services at St. Mary's Catholic Church featured music led by organist and chorister James E. Eckenroth.
- The admission price at a dance on Easter Monday at Armory Hall was just 55 cents. Specht's orchestra from Reading provided the music.
- Patschke's Garage at 1105 Cumberland Street advertised an Overland "4" automobile at \$845.
- The Lebanon Clearing House reported that over half a million dollars in checks alone changed hands in Lebanon on April 1.
- "Buy your Easter suit at Seitser's"

- "Wedding Bells Rang Merrily Over Easter." Light/Leininger; Shay/Crist; Hornstein/Menger; Carpenter/Huntington; Henne/Dierwachter, and more.
- Daily delivery by carrier of the *Lebanon Daily News* - ten cents per week.
- "Chicago is using 8000 gallons of whiskey a day for medicinal purposes, according to the Illinois State Prohibition Director. There must be a frightful lot of sickness in the city."
