**LEBANON COUNTY**  
**FEBRUARY 1930**

- "Roller Skating at Mt. Gretna Park - Open All Year Around." Wednesdays and Sundays at 2:00 and 7:30. Private Skating Parties Mondays and Fridays.
- "Hitch-hiker Robs Man in Lebanon Hotel - Returns hospitality of ride from Baltimore by stealing car, as well as \$1,000."
- 27,365 voters were registered in Lebanon County with 16,466 Republicans and 3,280 Democrats, 7,562 Non-partisan, 77 in 11 other parties.
- Thomas E. Yeingst opened a shoe-repair shop on College Street with an announcement that "Only American workmen will be employed."
- "City Comfort Station Again Discussed At Council Meeting, But no definite action taken."
- Colonel Charles A. Lindberg was 28 years old.
- "Sick or Run-Down? - Read Why These American Doctors Recommend Flaxolyn." - Dr. Victor P. Fleming, York, PA., Dr. Margaret Nesbitt, Ohio.
- "Hookie Boys" - members of the Hook and Ladder Fire Department were entertained at a "rare treat" luncheon by President J.K.R. Schropp, who announced that new rain coats and boots were being purchased.
- The 1930 Federal Income Tax was due March 15. One half of 1% normal tax on the first \$4,000 in excess of personal exemption, 2% on the next \$4,000, 4% on balance of net income. Surtax on income exceeding \$10,000.
- "Two Entirely New Cars" - Hudson's Great 8 - Standard \$1050, Phaeton \$1300, Seven Passenger \$1650; Essex, the Challenger - Coupe - \$735.
- The United States Treasury Balance in February 1930 was \$98,221,144.93.
- The Lebanon Fur House at Seventh and Cumberland Streets was selling Silver Muskrat Coats for \$100; Hudson Seal w/Mink Collar/Cuff \$297.50.
- The Lebanon County Insurance Day was observed by insurance agents at a banquet held at Hotel Weimer, George W. Stine, Chairman of the event.
