LEBANON COUNTY

IN MARCH 1930

- “LIQUOR RAID CREATED BIG STIR IN CITY” - J.O. Loos, deputy prohibition administrator reported that places raided included the Buck Hotel in Jonestown; South Fredericksburg Hotel, formerly Izzy’s Place; Northside Café; and the Royal Men’s Country Club, North Annville.
- The Reading Railroad under-pass west of Richland was declared unsafe and was to be rebuilt or removed with a new road running south of the railroad. County Commissioners: R. Weber, F W. Hurst, and William J. Noll.
- The Lebanon Historical society met in the basement of the Farmers Trust Company and elected Captain H. M. M. Richards as President.
- Avon Garage, Avon, PA announced “50-NEW AND USED CARS - 50“, including Willys-Knight - Whippet - Duesenberg and Auburn.
- “Repair, build additions, make alterations to your home and pay for the work in monthly installments - \$10.00 a month”. Penn Lumber Supply, Palmyra and Lebanon.
- James L. Atkins, Esq., was commander of the William H. Bollman American Legion Post located on South Ninth Street, Lebanon.
- The pupils of Fredericksburg High School presented the operetta “Tulip Time” at the Grange Hall in Jacksonville.
- A “Quilting Party” was held at the home of Mrs. Simon Tice in Cleona.
- The effect of the “Great Depression” was evident in the report of the United States Treasury Balance on March 10, 1930 at \$15,951,759.11 down from \$111,444,280.00 on January 30, 1930.
- The Essex “Challenger” automobile was sold by D. K. Wissler and Earl B. Sherk in Lebanon, Matthews Garage in Newmanstown, and H. S. Wagner, Palmyra.
- Trinity Reformed Church, Palmyra, presented “Daddy Long Legs”. a comedy in four acts.
- Irvin Ritter’s horse was stolen from his stable at Fourth and Lehman Sts.
