LEBANON COUNTY IN SEPTEMBER 1935

- Donkey Baseball was held at Albright Field in Myerstown - Married men vs. Single Men, on Monday, September 9 at 5:30 P.M.
- Samuel Light, Schaefferstown Road, Myerstown, was arrested by federal agents who seized a fifty-gallon still and 30 gallons of illegal liquor.
- Reg Kehoe and his entire Girl Marimba Band appeared at Mt. Gretna Park, afternoon special 10cts plus tax - evening 15cts.
- "Young Buffalo Bill" was one of the popular comic strips in the *Lebanon Daily News*.
- Arnold's Boot Shop was at 34 N. 8th Street - Mark R. Arnold, Proprietor.
- Mr. J. K. R. Schropp, Mayor of Lebanon was guest speaker at the Lebanon Businessmen's Association monthly meeting.
- Lebanon Public Schools registered 4,699 pupils, reported John W. Hodge, Superintendent of Schools.
- Popular United States Senator Huey Long of Louisiana visited Lebanon at a Long family reunion in Myerstown. Three pickpockets from Philadelphia were arrested.
- Fink's Bakery in Annville advertised "Honey Krushed Wheat Bread" for sale. "More Than Just A Food."
- A race car lost a wheel at the Fair Grounds Speedway. The wheel landed on the porch of C. L Missimer on Oak Street. He refused to give it up and sat on his porch with a shot gun to protect his find.
- In New York, Joe Louis, the 21 year-old "Brown Bomber", knocked out Primo Carnera before 60,000 boxing fans in Yankee Stadium.
